

## 2015 GRANT INITIATIVES

We will accept letters of inquiry in the following areas for our 2015 Mission Grant cycle:

- Refining alcohol-use disorder (AUD) diagnosis and referral to treatment
- Increasing access to AUD treatment and/or removing barriers to access
- Supporting increased and updated K-12 education on alcohol use and alcoholism
- Preventing alcohol abuse by young people and reducing associated harm
- Increasing coverage of AUD in medical school curricula
- Supplying physicians with up-to-date AUD diagnosis and treatment protocols and encouraging dialogue about AUD amongst physicians
- Developing or testing medications for AUD treatment
- Serving sensitive populations such as veterans, homeless people, Native Americans, or people with dual diagnosis
- Testing the efficacy of alternative treatments such as meditation or nutrition therapy
- Developing or testing new technologies supporting people in recovery
- Capacity-building for exemplary organizations in the AUD field that seek to expand or improve their operations

## WHO WE ARE

The Peter G. Dodge Foundation is a philanthropic organization dedicated to helping people lead lives free from the effects of alcohol addiction.

Founded by Hanover Research CEO Peter G. Dodge, we support the advancement of new treatments and the dissemination of up-to-date information about alcohol-use disorder (AUD).

## WHAT WE DO

We maintain an online resource where those who suffer from AUD can learn about treatment options and how to access them.

We operate two distinct grant programs: Mission Grants and Community Grants.

Mission Grants fund work that aligns with our primary mission: helping people lead lives free from the effects of alcohol addiction.

Community Grants improve the lives of young people through education, medicine, and the arts, and alleviate the suffering of animals.

## MISSION GRANT RECIPIENTS

In 2014, Mission Grants were awarded to:

### Faces and Voices of Recovery | Washington, DC

PGDF supported two projects, a conference on best practices for directors of non-profits in F&V's network, and an educational campaign related to the Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act.

### McLean Hospital | Belmont, MA

PGDF funded the development of a series of youth-focused events aimed at preventing alcohol abuse by young people.

### Hazelden Betty Ford Foundation | Minneapolis, MN

PGDF contributed to the Patient Aid Fund, which offsets costs for those in treatment at Hazelden's inpatient clinic. This gift was designated for people with a dual diagnosis of AUD with major depressive disorder or bipolar disorder.

### White Bison, Inc | Colorado Springs, CO

PGDF sponsored a pilot program to culturally adapt an existing treatment strategy to serve Native American populations.

### Oxford House | Silver Spring, MD

PGDF created a loan fund that will establish four new Oxford Houses, with the fund existing in perpetuity as residents repay their loans.

### C3 Foundation | Fort Myers, FL

PGDF gave a general support grant towards operating expenses and advocacy for the Sinclair method of AUD treatment.

### Baltimore Clayworks | Baltimore, MD

PGDF funded an art therapy program at Tuerk House, a residential facility for men in recovery.

### Pinhead Institute | Telluride, CO

PGDF sponsored a laboratory-based internship in the field of drug or alcohol addiction for a rural high school student with a strong interest in science.
